

## Parts of the Insect – 3 part matching cards

This PDF is laid out with two pages per sheet. The black line should be used as a guide when cutting.

Pages 2 - 8 contain both named and unnamed pictures for the parts of the insect.

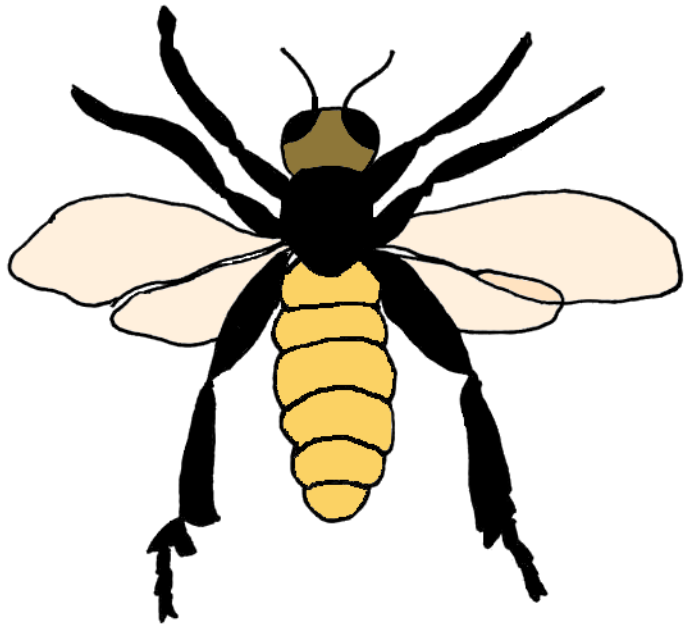
Print each page on white paper, cut along the black line so each page is cut in two, trim each section so that when mounted on yellow card a yellow border is visible.

Page 9 contains the names associated with the picture cards name. There are more name slips on the page than needed but it would be a waste of paper not to print them out and we're sure you'll find a use for them. Separate each name tag using the grid lines as a guide. Trim each card and mount on yellow card so a yellow border is visible.

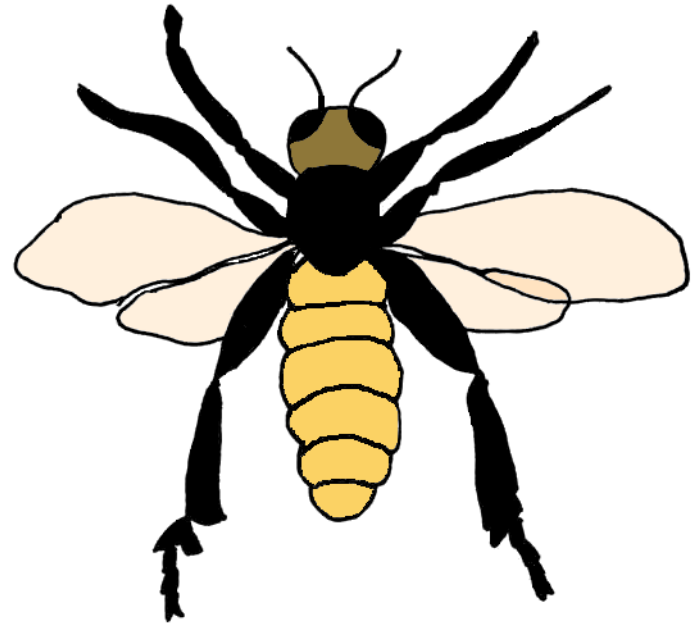
Page 10 contains a black line master which you can photocopy and give to the child to make their own parts of the insect book or the child can draw their own insect and label it.

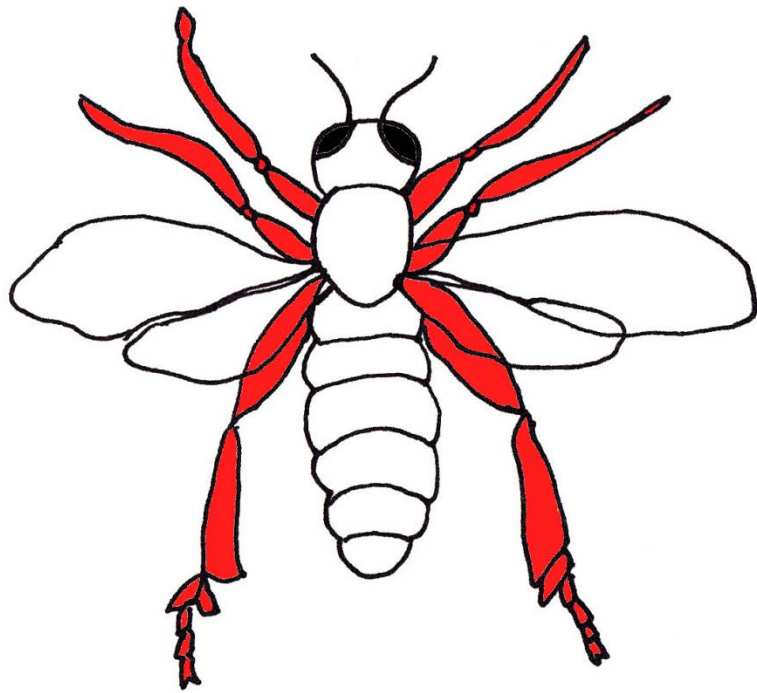
1. Use the pictures as a discussion aid. Asking children what they know about insects and if they know what part of the insect is highlighted, where an insect can be found etc.
2. Print the unnamed pictures twice and use as a simple matching exercise.
3. Match the unnamed pictures to the named pictures and match the corresponding name card.
4. As children work through the material they can make their own book of the insect by using the blank master on page 10 or by drawing their own insect and highlighting the various parts.
