Instructions for Information Cards – Birds (English)


This PDF is laid out as a grid. The grid lines should be used as a guide when cutting.

The following pages contain pictures of birds with the names underneath and information cards for the birds.

This material can be used in several ways and listed below are a few suggestions:

- 1 Print the named pictures twice, separate into individual cards and use as a simple matching exercise using just the pictures.
- 2. Have a magnifying glass with this resource and encourage the child to explore the pictures using it.
- 3. Print the named pictures but do not separate the birds into individual cards, use it instead as a bird spotter sheet and explore the garden to spot birds that are on the sheet.
- 4. Printed the named pictures of birds and the information cards and explore them with the child as if telling a story to the child. Asking the child what they see in the picture and adding more information by reading snippets from the information cards.
- 5. As the child's reading ability increases they can read the cards themselves and match them to the correct birds. Choose either to print the info cards with or without the inset picture of the bird.
- 6. Child can make his/her own book of birds by drawing or tracing the birds and colouring the birds to match the picture.
- 7. As the child's writing and reading abilities grow he/she can add information about the birds to the book.

wren

At just 10cm in length the wren is one of the smallest birds in Ireland. It has brown feathers and a short tail.



robin

The robin is a very welcome visitor to the garden. It has a bright red breast. The robin can be 14cm in length.



blackbird

The blackbird belongs to the thrush family. Males have black feathers a yellow bill. Females have brown feathers.



pied wagtail

The pied wagtail is 18cm in length. It has back and white feathers. Its long tail wags up and down.



song thrush

At 23cm the song thrush is 2cm shorter than the blackbird. It has a brown spotted breast and orange underwings. It also enjoys singing.



blue tit

The blue tit has a blue cap on its head. It has white cheeks on its face. It has yellow feathers on its torso. The blue tit is 14cm in length.



wren
