

Instructions:

This PDF contains simple definitions for the Parts of the Cow.

To save paper and reduce costs all of the definitions are on one page.

The page is laid out in a grid style and the page should be cut along these lines to separate each definition.

Each definition should be trimmed so that when mounted on Red card a Red border is visible.

Each card should be the same size as the cards used for the pictures of Parts of the Cow.

The Head

The head contains the eyes, mouth, ears, nostrils and horns.

The Hooves

The cow's legs end in hooves with two toes called cloven hooves.

The Tail

The cow has a long tail which is used to drive away annoying insects.

The Udder

This is a large organ under the cow's body. It has several teats which are used to feed the young calves.

The Horns

The cow has two horns which are used for protection.

The Cow

The cow is a large mammal. It is a domesticated animal and can be seen on most farms. It is a vertebrate.

The Legs

The cow has four legs.
Two legs in the front and
two legs in the back.

The Body

The body is where the
cow's vital organs such
as the heart and liver
are. The cow has a
stomach divided into four
different parts.
